## Nature and the Whole Child



We are excited to welcome Geoffrey Bishop, Founder and Executive Director Nature's Classroom Institute and Montessori School, to speak at our upcoming Parent Ed Night.

In 1996 Geoffrey started Nature's Classroom Institute Environmental Education. NCI is a residential environmental education program serving schools throughout the US. The NCI program helps students understand the natural environment, participate in ecosystem exploration and study, and work together with their peers and teachers as a community. The program serves over 4,000 students across the Midwest, Texas, California and

Florida, which includes over 90 Montessori school.

After developing a strong academic and environmental outdoor based curriculum, he formed Nature's Classroom Institute Montessori School on 140 acres in Mukwonago WI, serving students 3 years to high school. The Montessori school models the core philosophy of Montessori with a marriage to his environmental principles. Geoffrey is a dynamic speaker and has presented all over the world. His focus over the past years has been on organics and sustainability in schools and promoting getting children back outdoors and helping adults understand the importance of instinctive play in the nature

world. He is on the Board of Director's for AMS and the Chair of the Montessori Life advisory Board.

For our Parent Ed Night, Geoffrey will be leading a workshop focusing on "Nature and the Whole Child." Nature is a fundamental and essential aspect of educating the whole child. In mainstream education, the natural environment is often sidelined or overlooked. treated as inconsequential to a child's well-being. Yet research has consistently shown that a strong connection to the natural world enhances children's ability to focus, concentrate, create, take risks, and imagine. This connection also provides profound benefits to social, emotional, and physical health.

We long for a time when nature was part of everyday life.

Today, surrounded by electronics, mass media, and busy schedules, finding the time and energy to reconnect with the natural world can feel overwhelming. Phrases like "Nature Deficit Disorder", "No Child Left Inside", and "The Edible Schoolyard" often highlight our sense of inadequacy, leaving us feeling powerless to push back. But the truth is clear—nature is as vital to our health and development, socially, emotionally, and physically, as any academic or social pursuit.

This workshop will give parents both inspiration and practical strategies for weaving nature back into their children's everyday lives —helping them rediscover the joy, calm, and creativity that the natural world brings. Together, we will explore ways to nurture curiosity, creativity, and calm through nature -based experiences, including:

- Art and Nature creative projects that use the natural world as inspiration and material.
- Silence and Listening activities that help children tune in to the subtleties of the natural environment.
- Literature and Writing exercises that bring nature into the forefront of storytelling and reflection.
- Play and Loose Parts harnessing the open-ended possibilities of natural materials to encourage focused, imaginative play.

By the end of the workshop, parents will leave with fresh ideas and tools for supporting their child's connection to nature at home and beyond.

In 2010, a third building was completed to accommodate the growing enrollment and in 2011, a "natural" playground and an organic community garden were created. Funds are currently being raised to improve and grow our campus.
