Environmental Education

During Environmental Education, Mr. Ruddick sparked curiosity with a simple question: "How can we find out how tall a tree is?" Lower Elementary students eagerly offered creative ideas "We could climb to the top with a tape measure!" or "Use a really tall ladder!" Mr. Ruddick replied, "Those are great solutions! But how can we do it safely and without leaving the ground?" That's when he introduced an old lumberjack trick for measuring tree height using nothing more than a stick and a long tape measure.

Here's how it works: Find a stick about the length of your arm and hold it straight out in front of you, vertically. Then, walk backward or forward until the bottom of the stick lines up with the base of the tree and the top of the stick aligns with the top of the tree. Measure the distance from where you're standing to the base of the tree, and that's the tree's approximate height!



Students were amazed to discover that with just a bit of observation and simple tools, they could uncover the measurements of nature's tallest landmarks. Lessons like this remind us that learning outdoors not only deepens our understanding of science, it also nurtures curiosity, problem-solving, and a lifelong appreciation for the natural world.



In 2010, a third building was completed to accommodate the growing enrollment and in 2011, a "natural" playground and an organic community garden were created. Funds are currently being raised to improve and grow our campus.
