In 2001, the school moved to its permanent location after the construction of a new campus on 7.5 acres of donated land. In 2010, a third building was completed to accommodate the growing enrollment and in 2011, a "natural" playground and an organic community garden were created. Funds are currently being raised to improve and grow our campus.

Safety Drills & Visits

October is Fire Safety month so don't be alarmed if you see fire engines on campus!

Primary students will learn about fire safety and take the always popular "Touch a Truck" tour. Lower El students will experience a simulation with the department's mobile fire safety house. Upper El and Adolescents will meet with firefighters to discuss evacuation plans, home alone safety and big brother/sister responsibilities.



The fire and police departments will also observe and time our required intruder and fire drills this month. As a non-public school recognized by the Illinois State Board of Education, we must perform three fire drills and one police lockdown drill each year. School bus safety drills and tornado drills are also mandated and will be held throughout the year.
