Theater

In Montessori education, learning is rooted in deep respect for the child through hands-on experience and the belief that children grow best when they are trusted, challenged, and inspired. Theater epitomizes this philosophy. It offers students meaningful work that blends creativity, collaboration, and self-expression, along with the occasional forgotten line, quick recovery, and triumphant bow. It provides a space where those voices can shine whether through acting, movement, music, set design, or the very important backstage work that keeps everything running often invisibly. Every role matters. Every contribution counts. As students discover where their strengths lie, they grow in confidence, self-awareness, and a courage to try something new, sometimes under the bright lights.

Theater creates joy and connection, it builds community, fosters empathy, and reminds us all that learning can be expressive, collaborative, and deeply human. These shared moments, both the polished ones and the imperfect ones, become cherished memories that shape how students see themselves as learners and teammates. By honoring each child's voice, encouraging collaboration, nurturing empathy, and embracing experiential learning, theater enriches the educational journey. When theater is part of a Montessori school, it creates not only performers, but confident, compassionate, and capable individuals, ready for whatever stage life puts them on next.

The Montessori School of Lemont is a non-profit 501(c)(3) organization that has been educating children ages 3 through 8th grade for 50 years based on the methods and philosophy of Dr. Maria Montessori. The school was established in 1972 by teachers dedicated to offering families an individualized educational approach for their children. The school relocated to Lemont in 1990. In 2001, the school moved to its permanent location after the construction of a new campus on 7.5 acres of donated land. In 2010, a third building was completed to accommodate the growing enrollment and in 2011, a “natural” playground and an organic community garden were created. Funds are currently being raised to improve and grow our campus.

2026-27 Enrollment

As the new calendar year begins, it's time to start thinking about next school year. Applications for the 2026-27 school year are available and due by February 6 along with the application fee of \$100. After February 6th, the application fee increases from \$100 to \$200. Please remember that re-enrollment is not guaranteed. While currently enrolled families have priority, room placement is a multifaceted process and retaining current students is based on classroom availability.
